"There's no sign of a slowdown in the rising costs in the German skilled trades industry this year. This is a natural outcome of the market dynamics when high demand encounters limited supply. Despite the challenges posed by the wage-price spiral, the skilled trades are making significant strides. The emphasis on moderate price adjustments in favor of better pay strikes the right balance – not only to make entry into skilled trades more appealing but also to attract new talent and boost the competitiveness of the sector.

Looking to the future, urgent measures are required to tackle the shortage of skilled craftworkers. Failing to do so risks not only further price hikes but also a massive backlog of orders that could jeopardize major projects, such as the energy transition, if there are not enough craftworkers to install heat pumps or insulate homes. In the long term, we must inspire more young people to pursue careers in skilled trades.

In the short term, craftworkers must utilize their limited resources as efficiently as possible. We aim to support them with our digital solutions that streamline time-consuming routine tasks and optimize operational processes."

For the nationwide Price Index for German Skilled Crafts, OneQrew surveyed a total of 670 German skilled trade companies, primarily from the fields of plumbing, heating and air conditioning, electrical engineering, roofing, carpentry, joinery, metal and scaffolding construction, and painting, plastering, and stuccoing. The responses were collected through an online survey conducted between February 13 and March 21, 2023.



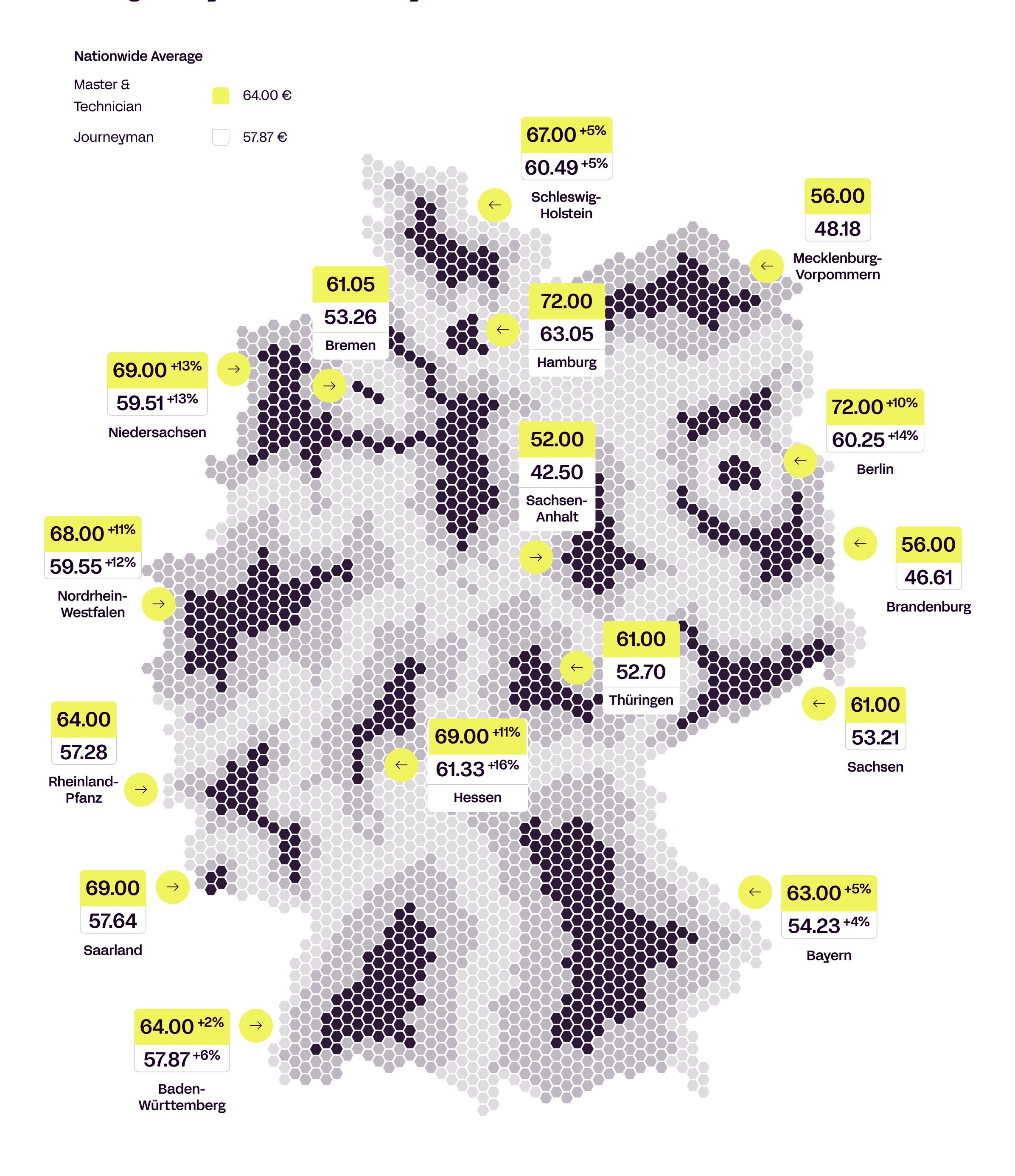








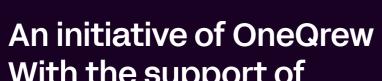
Average Hourly Rates Distributed by State

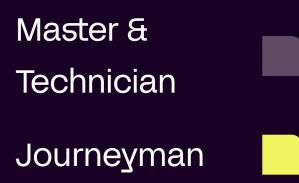






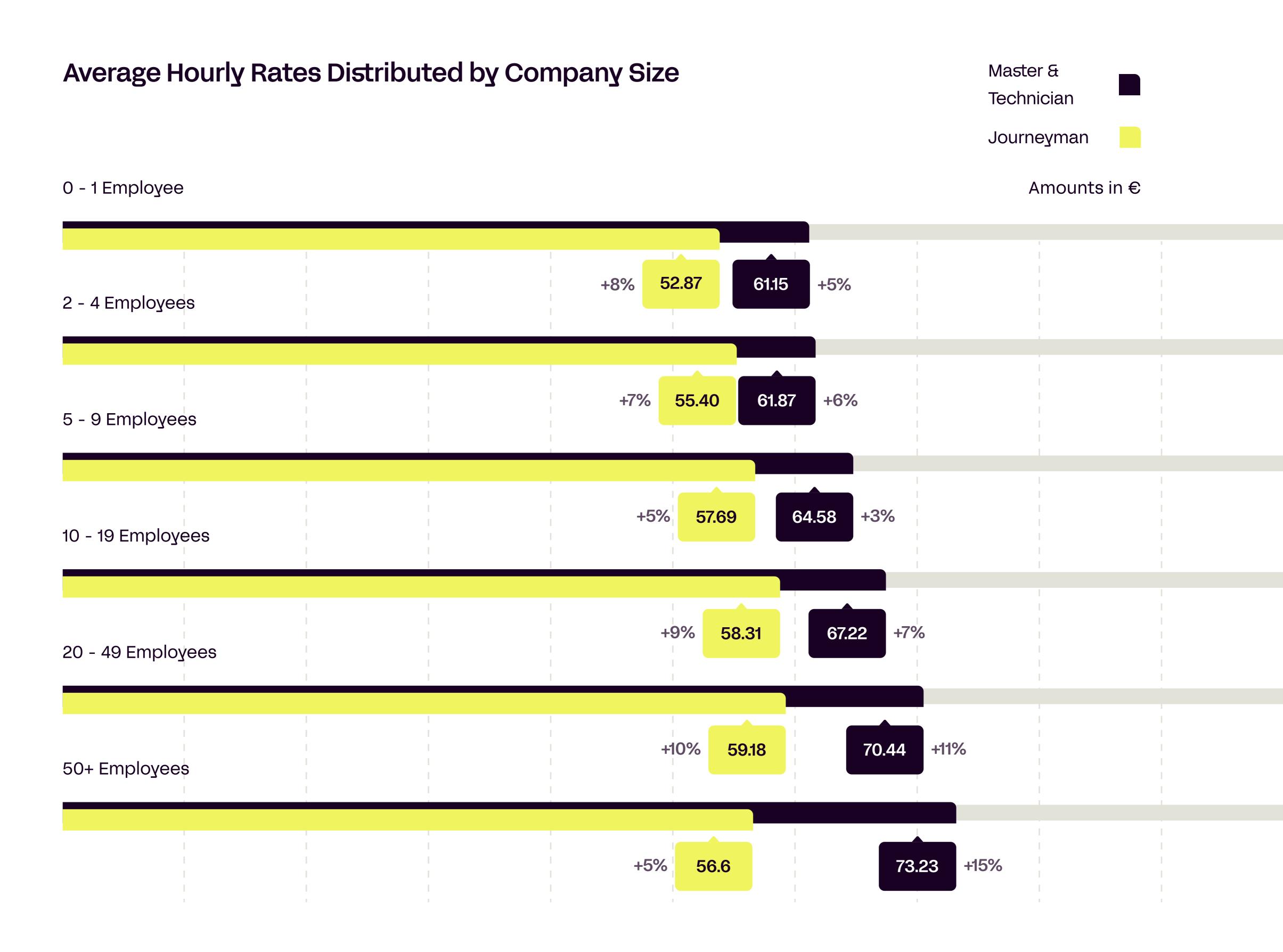


Average Hourly Rates Distributed by Trade



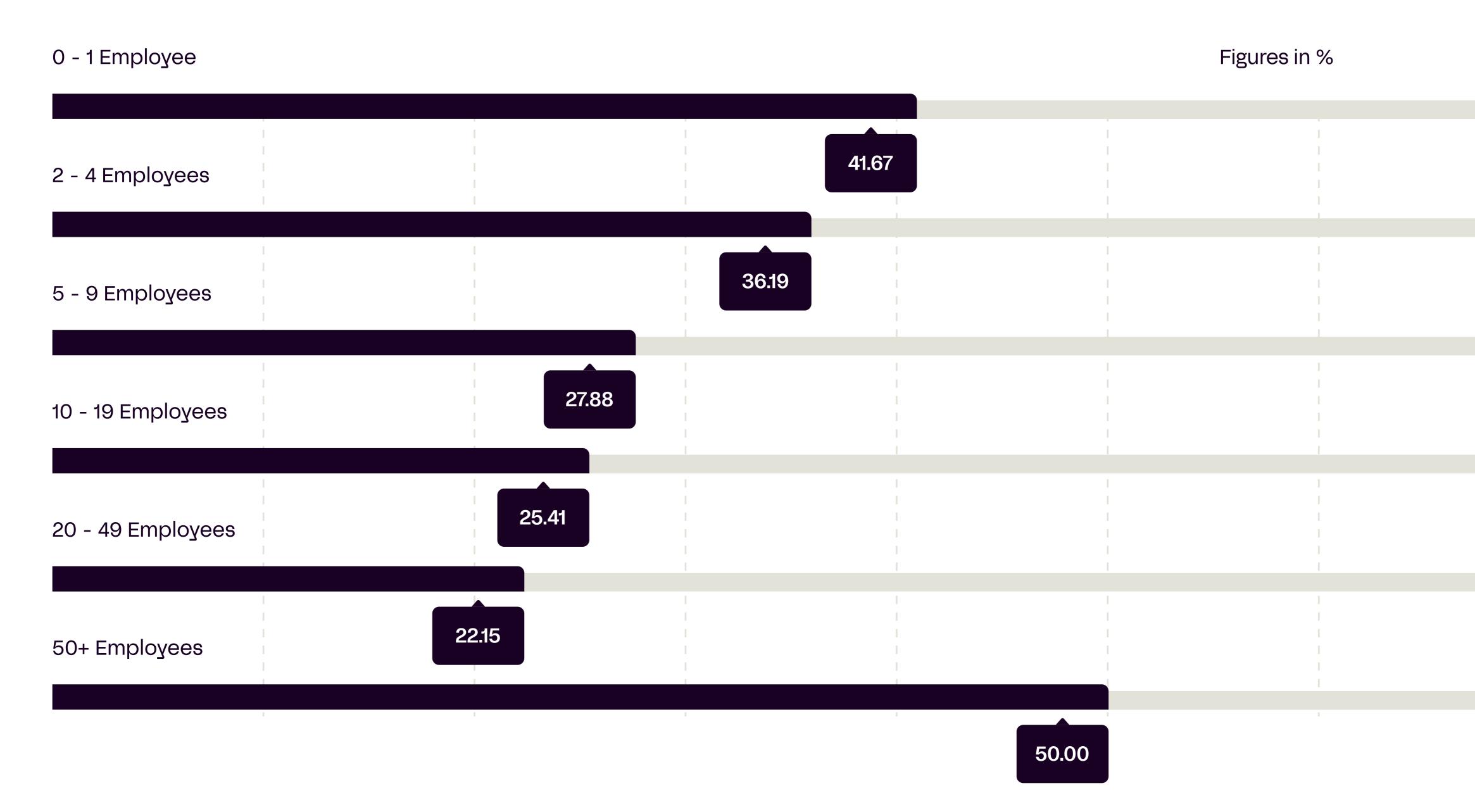






Companies Without Hourly Rate Adjustments

Percentage of Surveyed Companies that Maintained Their Prices During the Second Half of 2022 and 2023.





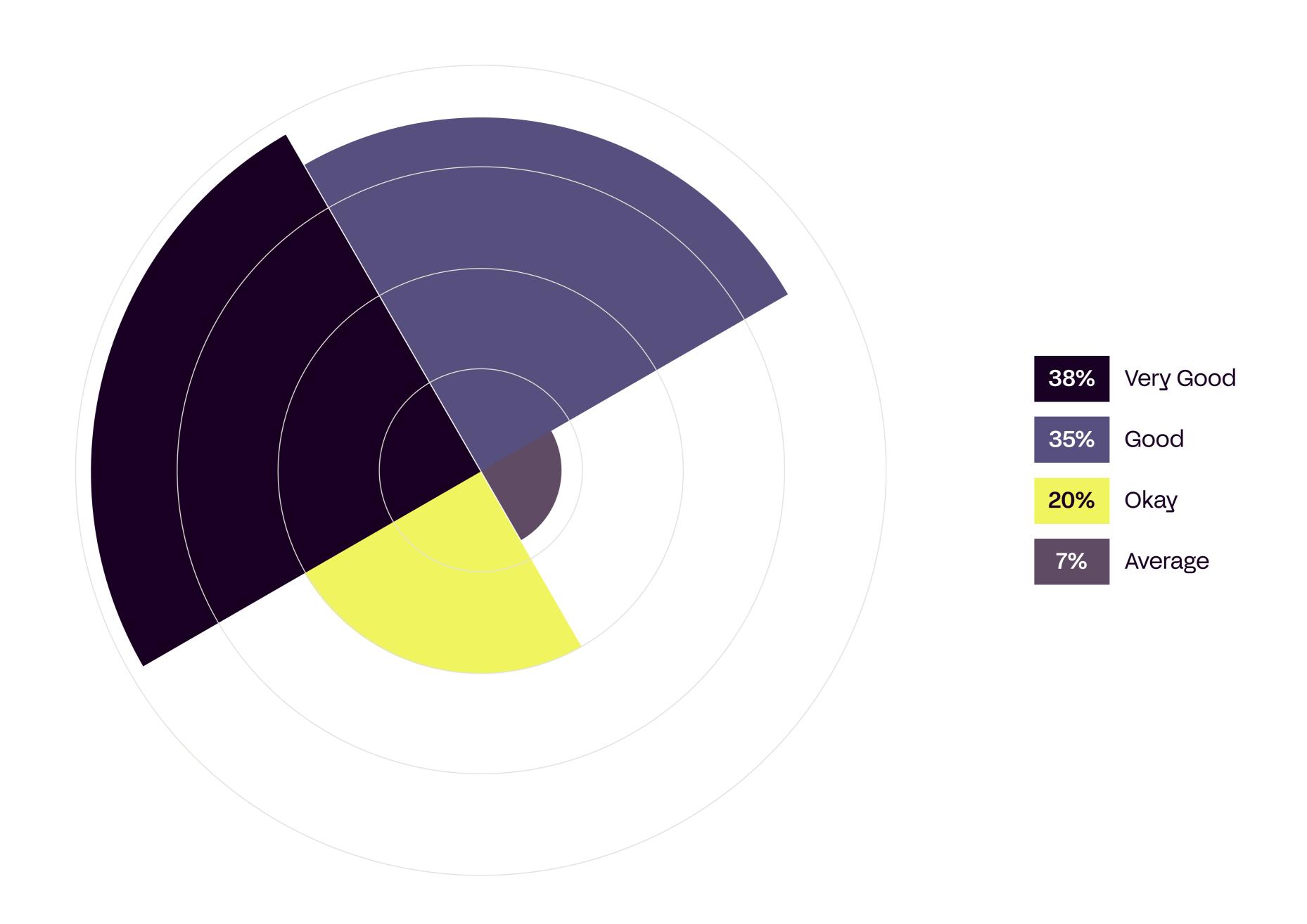
Currently, price increases can be observed across all industries. However, particularly in the electrical and plumbing, heating, and air conditioning sectors, there are noticeable developments as these industries exhibit restraint in raising prices. This could be due to previously implemented adjustments or pending increases.

On average, smaller businesses are more cautious about price increases. The primary construction industry is currently forgoing price hikes due to stagnation in new building projects.

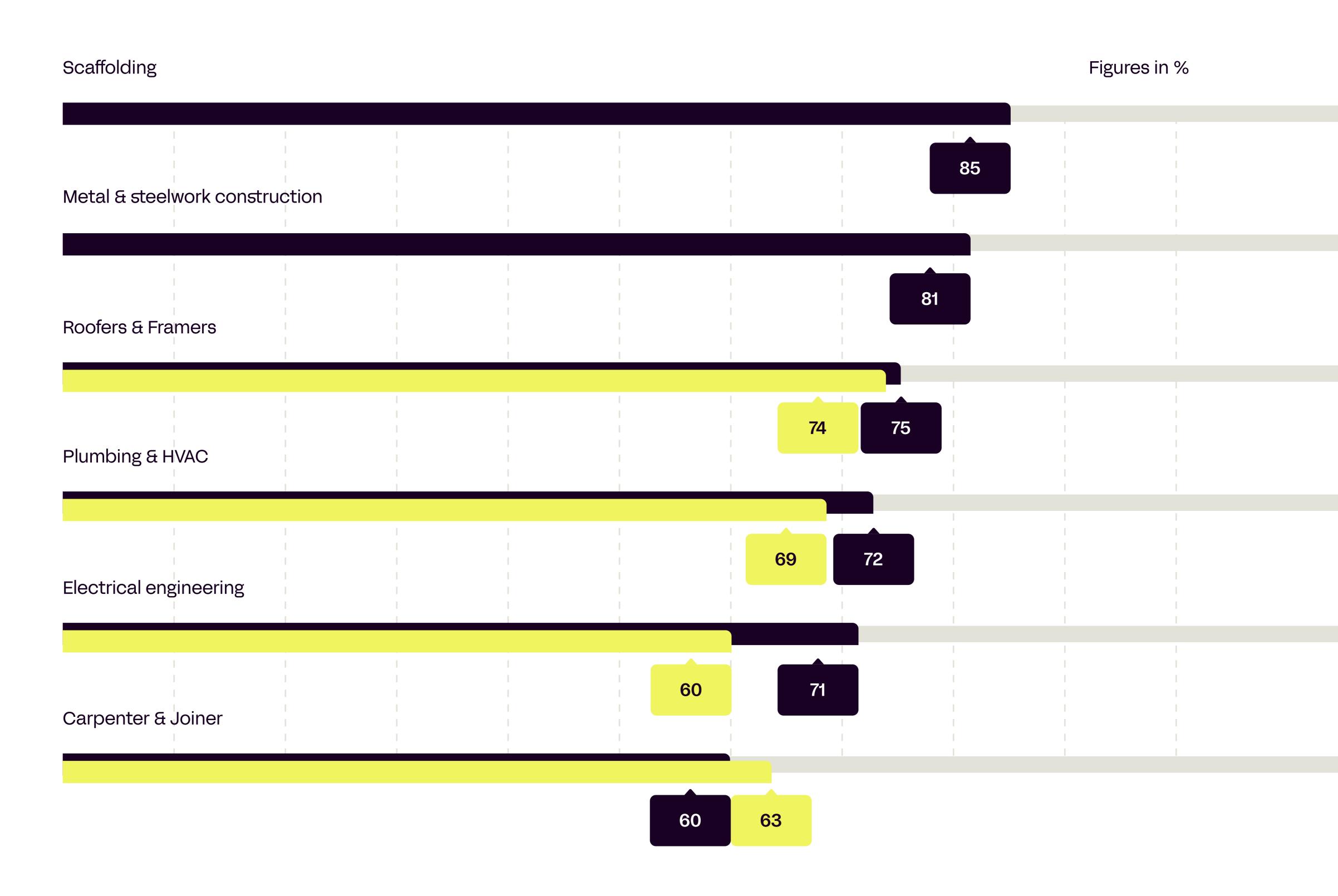

Job Vacancies Distributed by Trade

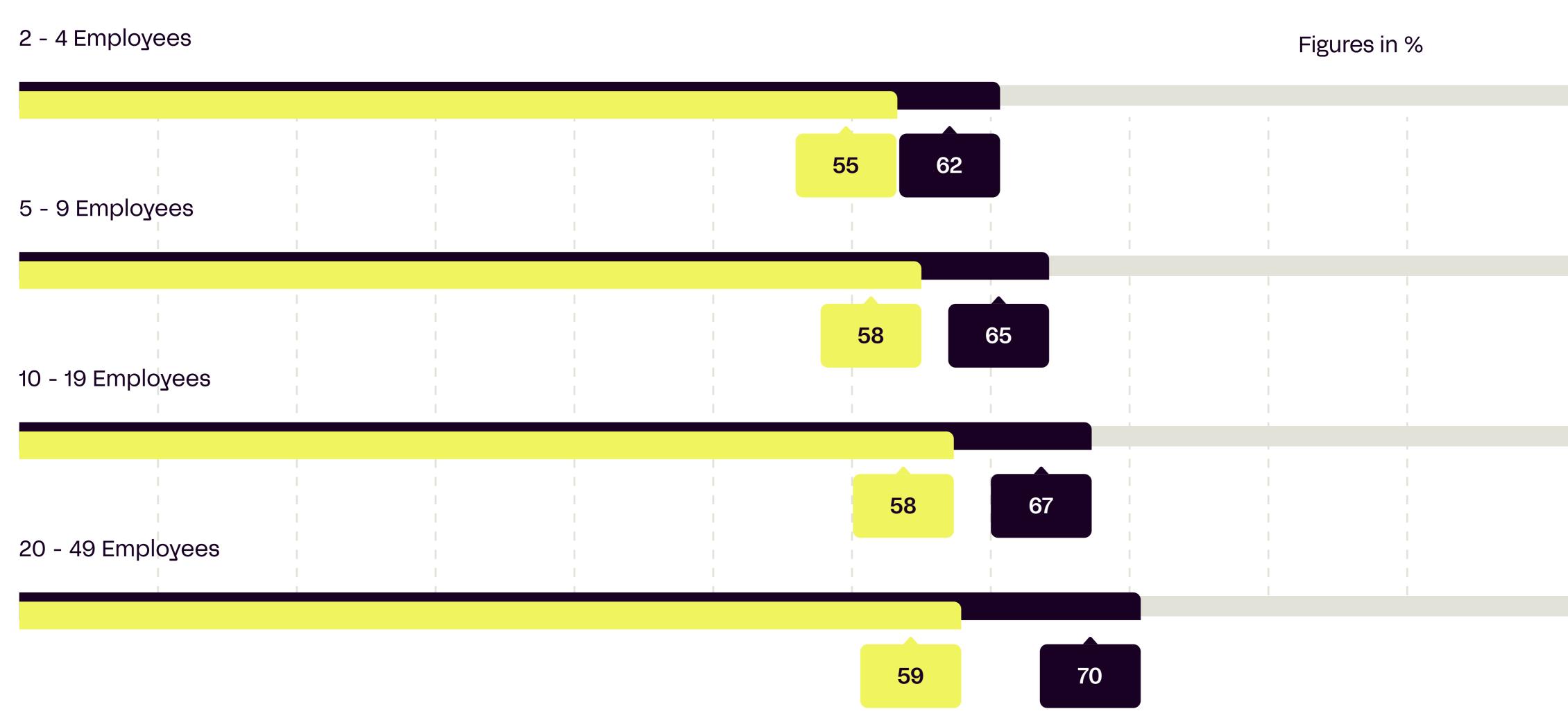
Percentage of Surveyed Companies Seeking Employees by Industry.
